2. Department of Florida Brothers will be in mourning through July 22, 2012. This includes affixing mourning ribbons on membership badges and draping charters at meetings.
3. Visitation will be at 1:00 pm Friday, July 6, 2012 at Wylie-Baxley Funeral Home, 1360 North Courtenay Parkway, Merritt Island. A memorial service will be conducted at 2:00 pm at the same location, with a reception immediately following at the Merritt Island Masonic Lodge, 247 South Tropical Trail, Merritt Island.
4. Captain Hinman's obituary was published in "Florida Today" on July 1, 2012. Brother Hinman had a career in law enforcement in New York State 1959-1981, and later with the United States Immigration Service in Toronto, Canada, West Palm Beach, and Port Canaveral, Florida. He also served for 33-years in the U. S. Air Force. He was a member of the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary, the U.S. Navy Radioman's and YAGR Ships' Associations, U.S. Air Force Security Police and Sergeant's Associations, Korean War, Vietnam War, Disabled American Veterans and Veterans of Foreign Wars Associations, International Police Association, the Fraternal Order of Police, and the Law Enforcement Emerald Society of South Florida.
5. Born in Kane, Pennsylvania to Randall and Lorena Hinman May 20, 1934, Brother Phil was a member of Hope United Church and was a Mason. He was a Knight of the Order of Saint John of Jerusalem, and a member of the Sons of the American Revolution.
